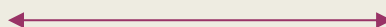

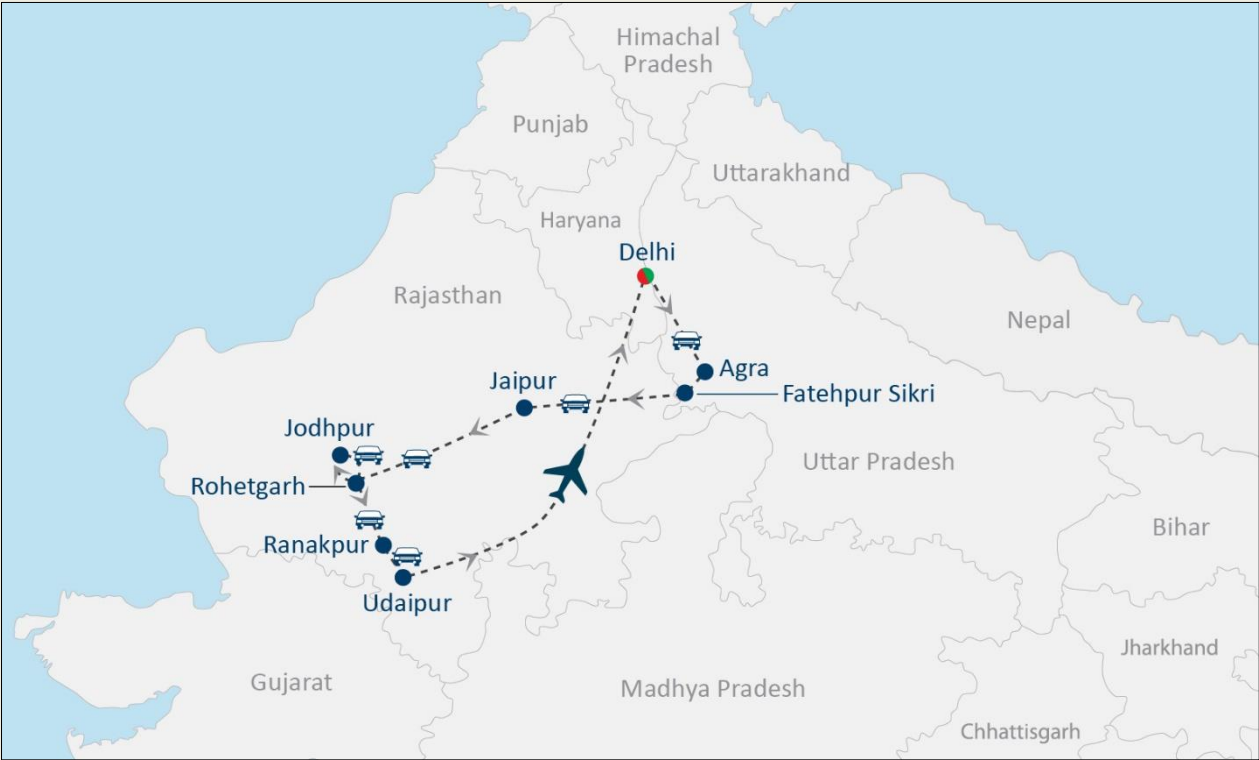

DETAILED ITINERARY

DELHI – AGRA FATEHPUR SIKRI – JAIPUR – PUSHKAR – ROHET – JODHPUR – RANAKPUR – UDAIPUR

DAY 01: ARRIVE DELHI

Upon arrival at Delhi International Airport you will be met by our representative at the gate and be assisted through Immigration, baggage collection and Indian Customs, transfer to the OBEROI NEW DELHI HOTEL and check in.

Overnight at hotel.

DAY 02: IN DELHI

Morning: Visit the Qutab Minar, the tallest stone tower in India, started by Qutab-ud-din Aibak in 1199. Attached to the Qutab Minar is the Quwwat-ul-Islam mosque, erected using the columns of 27 Hindu, and Jain temples that had been pulled down. Proceed to visit the Red Fort on the west bank of the Yamuna River, constructed by Emperor Shah Jahan as a royal residence and official complex. The palaces, mostly in marble, are along the riverfront. See the Halls of Public and Private Audience, the Royal Baths with inlaid floors, the Pearl Mosque, the private palace of the king, and the ornamental canal. Continue to India Gate, the memorial of the First World War. Drive past the landmarks of Lutyens-Baker New Delhi; this includes Rashtrapati Bhawan, the official residence of India's President and the former Viceregal Lodge, the Parliament House, and the Secretariat buildings.

Afternoon: Visit Humayun's Tomb, built by the widow of the second Mughal Emperor, a stunning precursor of the Taj Mahal in the Indo-Persian style. Proceed to visit Raj Ghat the cremation site of Mahatma Gandhi. Proceed to Jama Masjid, India's largest mosque built by Shah Jahan, cycle rickshaw ride through the narrow alleys of Chandni Chowk the principal marketing street of Shahjahanabad, and still a colorful commercial area.

Overnight at hotel (B, D).



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DAY 03: DRIVE DELHI-AGRA

Morning: Drive to Agra. Upon arrival transfer to THE OBEROI AMARVILAS HOTEL and check-in.

Afternoon: Visit Agra Fort, which evolved under the reigns of three Mughal Emperors. Note the apparent transition from the military might of the stern citadel raised by Emperor Akbar to the lavish beauty of shimmering white marble palaces built by Emperor Shah Jahan continue to the tomb of Itmad-Ud-Daula first white marble tomb in India and regarded as a draft of the Taj Mahal. Continue to Mehtab Bagh (Moonlight Garden) for picture perfect and unusual view of the Taj Mahal from across the Yamuna River.



Overnight at hotel. (B, D)

DAY 04: DRIVE AGRA-FATEHPUR SIKRI-JAIPUR

Sunrise: A visit to one of the most fabled sights on earth - The TAJ MAHAL, the legendary monument to love built by Emperor Shah Jahan in 1630 to enshrine the mortal remains of his Queen Mumtaz Mahal. This architectural marvel is a perfectly proportioned masterpiece fashioned from white marble. It stands testimony to the skill of artisans brought in from Persia, Turkey, France, and Italy and to 17 years of labor by 20,000 workers.

Morning: Drive to the magnificent deserted city of Fatehpur Sikri, built by Emperor Akbar in 1569 and later abandoned due to scarcity of water. Remarkably well preserved are the graceful buildings within the city, including the Jama Masjid, Tomb of Salim Chisti, Panch Mahal, and other palaces. The red sandstone palaces are in a perfect state of preservation. Lunch at Bharatpur.

Continue to Jaipur. On arrival, check in at THE OBEROI RAJVILAS HOTEL.

Overnight at hotel. (B, D)

DAY 05: IN JAIPUR

Morning: Drive to Amber Fort the ancient capital of the state, where the Jaipur royal house held court for seven centuries. Visit the magnificent gateways, courtyards, and pavilions, Jag mandir the Hall of Victory glittering with inlaid mirrors, Jai Mahal and the Temple of Kali.

Afternoon: Visit the Maharaja's City Palace with its fabulous museum. Inside the museum, find textiles, arms, carpets, paintings, and manuscripts, along with the Maharaja's two large urns, the largest silver vessels in India. Also, visit Jantar Mantar the Observatory of Maharaja Jai Singh II, constructed in 1716. Drive past Hawa Mahal Palace of Winds, used by the women of the palace to view the outside world. Continue through the rose pink residential and business areas of the city. Overnight at hotel. (B, D)

DAY 06: DRIVE JAIPUR-ROHET

Morning: Drive to Pushkar. Visit the famous Brahma temple and walk through the bazaars to the holy Pushkar Lake. Lunch at local restaurant. Continue to Rohet. Upon arrival, check in at ROHET GARH HOTEL.

Overnight at the hotel. (B, L, D)

DAY 07: IN ROHET

Morning: Excursion of Bishnoi villages. Jeep ride to the neighboring Bishnoi village: The Bishnoi faith established in 15th century by Guru Jambhoji. He outlined 29 conservation to preserve grassland, woods & soil. The Bishnoi villages in the desert have emerged as centers of superior harvest and productive cattle farming. They have also sustained the habitats of many desert flora & fauna.

Afternoon: Culinary workshops of traditional local Rajasthani cuisine.

Overnight at hotel (B, D).



DAY 08: ROHET–JODHPUR-ROHET

Morning: Drive to Jodhpur and visit Mehrangarh Fort. Strategically located on a mighty sandstone rock, the fort has never been captured. Palaces within are meticulously carved from hard sandstone. Paintings, thrones, banners, doors, weapons, and spectacular 17th century royal tent, on display in the fort's mausoleum. Also, visit Jaswant Thada, the cremation ground of the royal family, with magnificent translucent marble tombs. Also visit clock Tower market followed by a tuk-tuk (auto rickshaw) ride through the local markets. Jodhpur is famous for all cotton durries (rugs). Stop by Rawat Sweets a local shop famous for lassi (butter milk) and payaz ki kachauri (big nugget, deep fried and filled with finely cut onions, spices, and herbs).

Overnight at hotel (B, D).

DAY 09: DRIVE ROHET-UDAIPUR

Late morning: Depart to Ranakpur. Visit the Jain temples. The temples, built in the mid-15th century with intricately sculpted white marble, are extremely well preserved. Take special note of the Rishabji Temple, supported by 1,444 distinct pillars.

Lunch at Mana on fixed menu/buffet basis.

Continue to Udaipur, upon arrival, transfer to THE OBEROI UDAIVILAS HOTEL and check in.

Evening: Private boat at cruise on Lake Pichola, surrounded by splendid hills and palaces.

Overnight at hotel. (B, L, D)



DAY 10: IN UDAIPUR

Morning: Visit the Maharana's City Palace, which boasts a labyrinth of courtyards richly decorated with inlaid mirror-work, galleries covered with frescos, temples and kiosks. Proceed to Jagdish temple, which houses a remarkable bronze statue of Garuda the mythical bird. Visit Sahellyon Ki Bari the garden of the maids of honor with its exquisite fountains. Enjoy Bhartiya Lok Kala Mandela the folk arts museum, and a scenic drive around Fateh Sagar Lake.

Overnight at hotel. (B, D)

DAY 11: FLY UDAIPUR-DELHI

Late morning: Transfer to the airport for your flight to Delhi. On arrival you will be met and assisted through security, checking in, and passport control. (B)

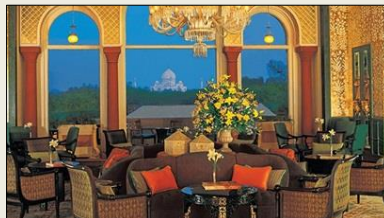

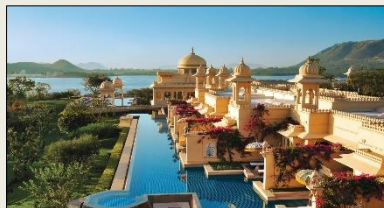
JAIPUR – THE OBEROI RAJVILAS
